
4) This came on the heels of Twitter's decision to suspend Q related accounts after claiming, without evidence, that they engage in violence.


Fifth column, <u>clandestine</u> group or faction of subversive agents who attempt to undermine a nation's solidarity by any means at their disposal. The term is conventionally credited to Emilio Mola Vidal, a Nationalist general during the **Spanish Civil War** (1936–39). As four of his army columns moved on Madrid, the general referred to his militant supporters within the capital as his "fifth column," intent on undermining the loyalist government from within.

11) On January 21st, 2017, the day after his inauguration, POTUS visited the CIA's headquarters.

As he closed his address, he made a joking reference to the 5th column that had developed inside the agency.



12) The arrest of Ghislaine Maxwell brings into the light her unusual skill set and the connections she has to powerful people.



13) The first few minutes of this video explain Maxwell's experience as a helicopter pilot and submariner.

17) After asking POTUS about Q, the media asked VP Pence.


18) Next, the media asked House minority leader Kevin McCarthy, who said "There is no place for Qanon in the Republican Party."



19) The media have decided to take discussions of Q mainstream.

One result of that decision is a record number of searches for Q during the last week.

This graph shows Google searches for Qanon since October of 2017 when Q first posted.



20) The decision by the press to take Qanon mainstream seems to have a strategic goal in mind.

They're targeting conservative leaders and trying to force them to weigh in on Q.

21) The goal is to get conservative leaders to denounce Q publicly by shaming them.

Apparently, the media believe that rejection of Q by respected leaders will discourage people from learning about Q for themselves.

22) Even though many people in Washington DC follow Q, they understand the importance of optics.

Aspiring politicians understand the popularity of Q and many of them will publicly affirm Q, hoping to grow their base of support.

23) But Q is a double-edged sword.

Elected leaders need to be concerned about alienating Q skeptics. I would expect anyone running for re-election to deny any knowledge of Q, even if they secretly read Q's posts.

24) That's the conclusion this article came to.

"Few other elected Republicans have been willing to speak out publicly. Mostly, they avoid questions about it (Q), demonstrating the thin line some officials are trying to walk."
