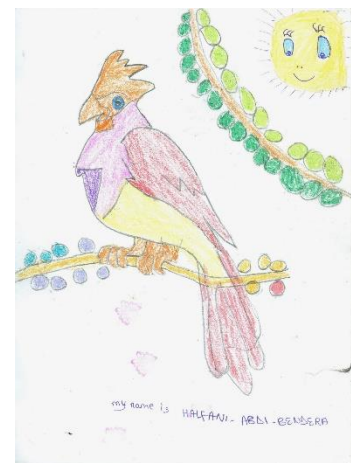

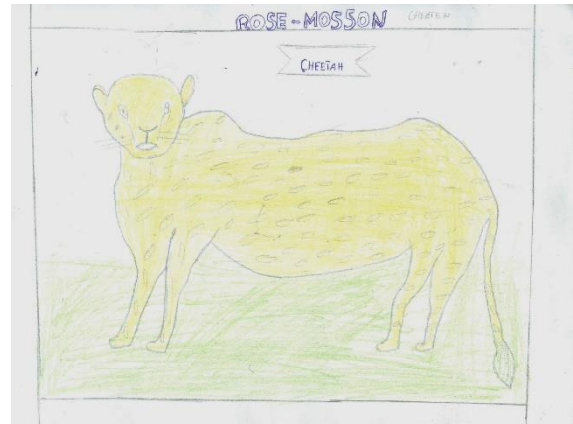

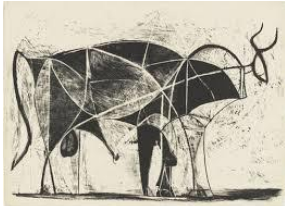

The world and the animals. Scientists have formally described and cataloged roughly 1.5 million animal species. However, based on advanced estimates, they believe there are about 7.7 million animal species on Earth—meaning the vast majority of our planet's animal life remains undiscovered. The Described Species (What we know) Of the ~1.5 million species documented by biologists, the distribution is heavily skewed toward tiny, crawling, and swimming creatures.

Germany has approximately 48,000 different species of animals. The vast majority of these are invertebrates, particularly insects, which make up about 33,000 of the varieties found across the country's forests, meadows, and mountains.

Tanzania is one of the most biodiverse countries on Earth, home to over 65,000 recorded species of animals. This incredible variety includes over 430 mammal species, more than 1,110 bird species, and thousands of amphibians, reptiles, and insects. It boasts the largest concentration of wildlife per square kilometer in the world. Because new species continue to be discovered in Tanzania's unique, isolated habitats (such as the Eastern Arc Mountains), these numbers serve as a minimum estimate.
