Facebook and Twitter preemptively warned they would censor posts about "election misinformation."

It's clear now it wasn't about pre-election.

They knew the steal was on and needed to hide posts about cheating after the election.

If you go to the President's Twitter page, half of his tweets have warnings over them.

Dear Mr. Dorsey,

We represent national, non-partisan organizations that work to ensure all voters have an equal opportunity to participate in the political process.

Throughout the 2020 U.S. election, we have closely tracked the use of Twitter's service to spread mis- and disinformation to millions of voters – potentially frustrating their ability to cast their ballots and undermining public trust in the integrity of our elections. We greatly appreciate Twitter's partnership in both removing and flagging content that could potentially harm voters, counteracting it with reliable information from official sources, and in publicly clarifying its Civic Integrity Policy. However, in certain instances, these remedial steps do not go far enough.

We are writing to request that, in response to President Donald Trump's repeated violations of Twitter's Civic Integrity Policy, that you suspend his account – an action that Twitter has taken in the past against other verified users who have also repeatedly violated your policies, including Katie Hopkins, David Ernest Duke, former member of the Louisiana House of Representatives, Rose McGowan, among others. We are not aware of any exceptions for current elected officials who, by virtue of their position, pose an even greater threat to the public when allowed to repeatedly violate your policies with impunity. President Trump's repeated use of Twitter's service to amplify false claims regarding our elections stand in deliberate violation of the platform's Civic Integrity Policy. We urge that @realDonaldTrump be temporarily suspended from the platform.

Twitter's Civic Integrity Policy forbids "misleading claims about the results or outcome of a civic process which calls for or could lead to interference with the implementation of the results of the

claims that cause confusion about the established laws, regulations, procedures, and methods of a civic process, or about the actions of officials or entities executing those civic processes."<sup>2</sup> Twitter may temporarily lock accounts for violations of its Civic Integrity Policy or permanently suspend offending users for severe and repeated violations.<sup>3</sup>

In the last day, President Trump has used Twitter's platform, in violation of Twitter's Civic Integrity Policy, to repeatedly broadcast false claims about the 2020 election – including, but not limited to:

- Claiming victory "for Electoral Vote purposes" the states of Pennsylvania, Georgia, and North Carolina, when no such claims have been made by state officials.<sup>4</sup>
- Amplifying unproven assertions regarding "a large number of secretly dumped ballots."<sup>5</sup>
- Alleging the unauthorized deletion and/or addition of votes,<sup>6</sup> unsubstantiated claims which would constitute a felony violation of federal election law.<sup>7</sup>
- Spreading a debunked<sup>8</sup> claim that 128,000 new votes spontaneously appeared in Michigan.<sup>9</sup>

President Trump has also used Twitter's platform to openly call for election interference by falsely claiming that any ballot received after Election Day will not be counted.<sup>10</sup> This is in direct violation of Twitter's Civic Integrity Policy, prohibiting misleading claims that cause confusion.

We understand the difficult situation Twitter finds itself in as it works to balance the newsworthiness of a public figure's use of the platform, and the potential threats to democracy and public safety from its unfettered use. We believe that, particularly in the next 24-48 hours, the balance must be weighted towards the free, fair, and transparent operation of our civic processes.

Common Cause and 9 others

The subject of the day on social media is the exposure of rampant voter fraud in swing states. There are reports of:




- Dead people voting
- Greater than 100% registered voter turnout
- Vote dumps of tens of thousands of ballots, all for Joe Biden

- Late “discovery” of tens or hundreds of thousands of mail-in ballots
- Backdating late ballots

Here’s the latest on how elections stand in key states.

In Georgia, the Secretary of State initially said this morning, there were less than 25,000 ballots left to be counted, but a few hours later announced some districts had not uploaded their returns and then said there were between 50,000 and 60,000.

Trump’s lead in Georgia has decreased to around 9,500 votes.

 Jo Jorgensen Libertarian Party	1.2%	60,821

In Georgia, a recount can be requested if the final margin of victory is 0.5% or less.




Joe Biden pulled to within that margin. Whoever loses will likely request a recount.

The President’s legal team is challenging the way ballots are being counted in Georgia.

In Arizona, there has been little change in the last 24 hours.



With 88% of the vote counted, Joe Biden leads by 67,906 votes.

The President is still on track to win the state if he gets 58-60% of the vote.

Arizona law allows a recount when the margin of victory is less than 0.1%.  
A recount seems unlikely in AZ.  
There are no legal challenges in Arizona at this time.


In Nevada, Joe Biden's lead has increased to around 11,400 votes.  
Only 76% of the votes have been counted.

 <b>Donald Trump</b> Republican Party	48.5%	592,813

It's still possible that the President can win Nevada.  
Trump's legal team claims to have evidence that illegally cast ballots have been counted and they've filed a lawsuit to have them thrown out.

In Pennsylvania, the President's lead has shrunk from 600,000 votes to 90,000 votes.  
Trump's legal team is challenging the way ballots are being counted in Pennsylvania.
