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
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A LOS ANGELES RESIDENCE CELEBRATING ART AND NATURE


Organic architecture experts Kristopher Conner and James Perry of Conner + Perry Architects were commissioned by a deeply-rooted Los Angeles couple to design a home that seamlessly fits their family and lifestyle, while also showcasing a world-class art collection and effortlessly blending into a beloved section of Santa Monica Canyon.

Taking cues from the property's surrounding Oak and Eucalyptus trees, the firm designed a residence that allows for reflection, openness, and serenity. Key design features include windows that frame the magnificent trees, extended canopy-like, cantilevered eaves, and fully pocketing glass



exterior walls that open to a central courtyard to offer the perfect balance of indoor-outdoor living. Every view in the house was designed to captivate with either nature or art. Initial plans by John Lautner protégé, architect Duncan Nicholson, set the stage for Kris and James, formerly with Nicholson's office, to complete and enhance the project, despite his untimely passing.

The property was formerly home to a modest California 1940's era cabin situated on a wooded lot that began as a test station for the Forestry Service during their Eucalyptus tree testing in the 1910-20s. It was important for the clients to honor this history and salvage as much of the original house as possible.







Given their love for the neighborhood and its majestic trees, they repurposed felled Eucalyptus wood found on the property into outdoor furniture and key elements within the house, including the grand entry doors. In keeping, exterior materials for the new home were selected for their organic nature, ability to age in place, and compatibility with the climate, such as charred wood siding (Shou Sugi Ban), copper, exposed steel, and concrete. Interior materials were chosen to reflect the nature outside, including a mix of massangis grey limestone and french oak for the flooring, weathered brass, blackened steel elements, and a variety of marbles and tiles, including art tiles by Lubna Chowdhary.

PASSIVE COOLING THERMAL ENERGY STORAGE

WHY BUILDING ENVELOPE TES?

PCMs can be selected so that they freeze and melt at the appropriate temperature to ensure that the building doesn't overheat or overcool. By introducing PCM into the building envelope it is possible to vastly increase the thermal mass of a building, helping ensure that rooms are maintained within the thermal comfort zone.

By installing PCM modules inside the building fabric itself, the end-users gain the thermal and performance benefits of PCMs without even being aware that they are in place.





TAKE ADVANTAGE OF NATURAL COOLING

ThinICE modules can be installed at high levels so that heat goes up but doesn't come back down. This cooling effect can provide relief to building inhabitants or for electronic equipment.

If the site is located in a region where there are large daynight temperature swings, then it is possible to provide free cooling by ventilating the room at night to freeze the PCM modules by the morning. The size of the cooling machinery could then be greatly reduced leading to lower emissions, reduced maintenance costs and reduced operational costs.

For a standard 595x595mm ceiling tile, two ThinICE modules can be installed offering up to 0.96 kWh/m2 of energy storage. At an installed weight of up to 24kg/m2, most suspended ceilings are more than capable of handling this additional load. These are ideally fitted above a perforated metallic suspended ceiling. ACTIVE COOLING WITH A PASSIVE SAFETY NET


It's easy to upgrade these passive cooling systems into an active chilled ceiling. This greatly improves the flexibility of a conventional HVAC system. Should, for any reason the HVAC machinery fails the frozen PCM modules offer an uninterruptable emergency relief cooling system giving the facility maintenance team an opportunity to react.


This also offers load-shifting capabilities. Load shifting is a strategy, where a proportion of the peak cooling capacity of a system is shifted into off-peak periods.

The benefit of shifting cooling into the nightly off-peak is twofold, firstly it is possible to gain access to cheaper electricity tariffs and secondly, the refrigeration equipment can be operated in lower ambient conditions leading to a higher COP.

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STUDIO LOFT: A UNIQUE REMODELING PROJECT WITH A GAINED TRIPLE FUNCTION

In today's world where efficient and creative use of space has become a necessity, the idea of remodeling existing structures has received growing interest and enthusiasm.

Moreover remodeling designs that manage to accommodate and mingle several functions are increasingly being sought after.

'Studio Loft' is an example of the transformation of a double flat in an existing five-story building in a densely populated neighborhood of Izmir into a multifunctional duplex space. Above all it is simultaneously a workspace, a 'photographic studio' and a residential space, a 'loft' to live in. The client who is a famous photographer and an artist based in Izmir worked closely with the architects of Yerce Architecture & ZAAS in the designing and creation of a new 'home' for himself, which he wanted to be something more than just a place to live and work in.

Hence an exhibition area was incorporated into the studio space enabling the owner, as well as local talents, to display their photographic work, which would serve as an alternative art exhibition spot in the center of the city where art galleries are rather scarce. The entrance zone of 'Studio Loft', once two separate flats is now a duplex unit and an open spacious area with a double-height ceiling. Entering 'studio loft', one steps right into the photographic studio and exhibition space. On the same floor at the back is a guest bathroom with a vaulted ceiling that solves the height restriction problem. Material choices of the bathroom with their reflective surfaces give one a sense of being inside a futuristic space, which also serves as an out-of-the-ordinary photography setting. A sculptural staircase, designed with no railing on either side to highlight the dynamism and rhythm of circulation inside the space, connects the ground floor to the upper floor. While the ground floor is designed to fulfill the needs of a photographic studio and an exhibition space, the upper floor is planned to host office space, kitchen area, sleeping and private resting zones at the far end of the open plan living space. Reflecting on the owner's lifestyle who loves to cook for his guests, the kitchen is a social space for cooking, eating, and relaxing.

Next to the kitchen is another spot with a cozy fireplace for gathering with friends and resting. Floor-to-ceiling windows offer bright panoramic views to the greenery outdoors.


The upper floor has also been designed to serve as an additional space for photo shootings if wanted, as one of the targets of the project was to maximize the space for photographic work. The result has been the creation of a 'loft' space that serves multiple functions, intertwined with each other, under the roof of a photographic studio. This is the outcome of how the architects approached the challenge, stated by Nail Egemen Yerce, founder of Yerce Architecture as "Answers were sought to questions such as how could space initially constructed as a typical, standard apartment be transformed into a multifunctional area serving different functions and forms of living while maintaining permeability within these functions."

Ayça Taylan, the co-founder of ZAAS, adds that "the project also reached out to the public, that is the outside world, through the exhibition space incorporated into the photography studio." Viewing the outside world and the inner space as a continuum, the architects transformed the open space in front of the apartment, formerly used as a car park into a patio. The paving material of the ground floor was extended to cover the patio and the sidewalks, leading to the integration of the whole space.

Furthermore, the sliding glass doors of the facade, which could also be completely folded up at the sides, contributed to the fusion of the inner space with the urban space in an exhibition event. Taylan continues that "the street flowing into the inner space and vice versa enables a passer-by to have a look at the exhibition without a filter." On an exhibition opening night the wide sidewalk, integrated with the patio in front of the loft, becomes extended outside social area for the visitors.

Despite the difficulties encountered in the construction process, most notably in time and budget, Studio Loft materialized as a new urban dwelling and working space typology with the additional function of being an exhibition place. Meeting the challenge of serving a triple function in the same space and time, this unique remodeling project stands out as an example of architectural wizardry.



TOP TIPS FOR CHOOSING BI-FOLD DOORS

Neil Ginger, CEO at Origin, offers his advice for choosing the perfect bi-fold doors for your property.

1. INVEST IN MATERIALS THAT LAST

Before purchasing bi-fold doors, it is vital to consider materials. There are three materials that tend to be used for bi-fold doors – uPVC, wood and aluminium. Each has their benefits. For instance, uPVC is often the cheapest option, but comes with thick sightlines and can warp over time. Wooden frames look fantastic on period properties but require regular maintenance to keep them performing well.

By contrast, aluminium offers a perfect combination of strength, durability and weight, allowing for narrow frames and making it a fantastic option for those looking to maximise the amount of light let into a property and create the ultimate 'wow-factor'.

Aluminium is also resilient to flexing and expanding and is the most low-maintenance option, meaning it offers the best return on investment in the long-run. What's more, the Origin Bi-Fold Door comes with an industry-leading guarantee of up to 20 years, offering ultimate peace of mind.

2. CHOOSE A DESIGN THAT SUITS YOUR PROPERTY

Opting for completely customisable bi-fold doors will allow you to create the perfect design to suit your home, whether it's a period property, a newbuild, or anything in between.

High-quality aluminium doors can be powder-coated in a huge range of colours, including authentic wood grain finishes and two-tone options, so consider whether you want your new doors to blend in or contrast with the rest of your property.

It is also important to consider the best configuration to suit your home and lifestyle. Bi-fold doors can be installed to open from one side, in the middle or at various other points. They can also be created to fit bays and corners, making them more versatile than any other type of patio door.



3. CHECK THERMAL EFFICIENCY RATINGS

Before purchasing bi-fold doors, it is important to consider thermal efficiency. The best indicators of thermal efficiency are U-Values which show the amount of heat lost in watts per square metre of material. The lower the number, the better the thermal efficiency. For instance, Origin doors achieve U-Values as low as 1.2, which far exceeds UK requirements.

High quality doors will also feature a polyamide thermal break in the profile, which is designed to improve energy efficiency, allowing homeowners to enjoy the room all year round.

4. PRIORITISE SAFETY

As bi-fold doors are likely to link to the outside of the property, it is vital to prioritise security.

For maximum safety, check that the system conforms to PAS 24:2016 security standards. Opting for doors that incorporate heavy-duty zinc hinges and a cylinder lock will also ensure that they are resistant to attacks for potential intruders. For ultimate reassurance, homeowners should opt for doors that are accredited with the police-approved Secured by Design standard.

For those with young children in the house, we always recommend choosing doors with finger-safe gaskets to stop little hands from getting trapped and magnetic catches that can help hold the doors in place whilst you're operating them.

THE HAWTHORNS



The glass box for this contemporary extension was installed with both structural glass walls and a structural glass roof.

Glass box extensions are the ideal addition to a home, as natural light is invited into the glass box and the existing building it connects to. The large panes of glass also allows greater appreciation of the client's garden landscaping, beyond the opaque walls of the home.

The garden facing wall of the extension was created using one piece of insulated glass measuring 3.5m wide and 2.3m tall (7.9m2). The resulting glass weight is nearly 500kg but allows greater appreciation of the client's garden from inside.

Jake, Commercial Director at IQ says, "Glass box extensions are the ideal addition to a home, as natural light is invited into the glass box and the existing building it connects to. This type of glass box design is very popular with home owners who want to add an more space to their home."

The steel framing and pressings installed to this design were Polyester Powder Coated in the same RAL colour as the minimal windows sliding doors, resulting in a cohesive design. Parts of the glazing were also back painted in order to give the design an immaculate finish; Jon, Designer at IQ describes it as "an 'all glass' design with light reflecting surfaces." In keeping with the minimalistic framing of the glass box extension, the minimal windows sliding doors' thin sightlines help to further the outdoor-indoor environment. The sliding door system employed by IQ uses a flush threshold, which allows for a sleek transition, rather than an abrupt switch, between home and patio.

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External steel windows can boast interlocked steel glazing bars if specified which make them incredibly strong and secure. 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








UNDERFLOOR HEATING



THINICE APPLICATIONS

By introducing eutectic products into a radiant heating system, it is possible to capture excess heating during the day time and maintain that heat into the cold of night. 27°C (81°F) phase change material (PCM) is sealed inside HDPE modules. This material captures energy by melting and releases it when it freezes. All conventional floor finishes are rated to handle these temperatures.

Each module features a number of grooves which are optimally spaced out for runs of underfloor heat pipes, this close contact with the PCM ensures the best heat transfer



possible. They allow for pipe lengths to be easily held in place during the installation process requiring no specialist skills. Once installed, the thermal mass of a building may be increased by as much as 10~15 times. Thanks to there being no moving parts, PCM TES is effectively maintenance free and once installed it simply becomes part of the building. For the best results, this can be paired with a ground source heat pump (GSHP) or other renewable heating systems so that the entire PCM TES can be charged with free energy and then discharged nightly.

INSTALLATION

At normal conditions the PCM will be in solid form, making the modules very robust. Rows of modules can be laid directly on top of the insulation layer replacing conventional castellated panels. This creates a grid which allows the heating pipe to be laid easily, holding the heat pipe in place throughout the screeding process to ensure that the finished underfloor heating system will distribute heat evenly.



Eight PCM modules can be installed per m2. This allows for up to 0.995 kWh/m2 TES.

For installers, it is important that the heating system has the appropriate power. This can be easily estimated using the below:

EXAMPLE

An underfloor heating system is planned for an 25m² room. There is an anticipated peak heat load of 1400W and there is a 10 hour charging period available. Using the above, we know that approximately 200 PCM modules could be installed. The heating system power can also be estimated:

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

Nominal operation pressure is 1-7 bar and it uses a 230V AC 50Hz 1ph power supply with an electrical consumption of 68W. Meanwhile, where an external installation is required, the Rinnai 17e external multipoint water heater offers greater flexibility at the design stage and offers a viable solution where flue runs are problematic or internal space is not available. 
The 17e has full frost protection and is available with a range of external ancillary items, including pipe cover box – and security cage where necessary.

For smaller properties, the Infinity IIi interior unit differs from the 17i as it weighs 2kg less at 16kg and consumes 6.10kW-21.60kW of Natural Gas and has an 11-litre maximum flow.

Ahead of DIY season and given we're all spending more time at home, Tempur Sleep Expert and chartered psychologist Suzy Reading has compiled a guide on how to rework a bedroom for better sleep.

Suzy says: "The bedroom is the ideal place to start when considering how to improve our sleep environment. It sounds simple, but without careful consideration, a bedroom can inhibit good sleep. "Loud, brash colours in a bedroom can inadvertently keep us more awake, while gadgets emit blue light and prevent us feeling drowsy in the run up to sleep.

"Good bedroom design needn't cost a fortune; it's about making small changes to improve the space and boost its sleep-inducing qualities."

Read on for Suzy's sleep-inducing bedroom design tips.

Colour scheme

In interior design, colour groups fall into two categories – cool colours and warm colours. For the best night's sleep, use cool colours in the bedroom as these help the body to unwind, ready for sleep. Light blue, moss green, soft yellow and dusky grey all work well. Choose a colour that has meaning to you. If you love green, it will work better for you than blue, for example.

Warm colours, on the other hand, can have an adverse effect and have been shown to raise the heart rate and blood pressure, increasing our likelihood of staying awake. Avoid using red, purple or any bright colours as these prevent melatonin release, which the body produces to wind down ahead of sleep. If you are really set on using a bright colour, try adding as an accent colour, rather than one overpowering block of colour. Include colours in artwork or cushions, for example.

INTERIORS

Feng Shui

Feng Shui is based on the principles of adding balance to a space for added calm. In a bedroom, this means implanting a design based on symmetry and pairing items together. For example, place two bedside tables on either side of the bed or install a pair of paintings. You could also add matching potted plants for more impact.

Feng Shui also means keeping a space clear and devoid of clutter, so be selective with furniture and keep clutter and ornaments to a minimum. Take a 'less is more' approach and keep the bedroom clean and tidy, as this will only improve sleep long-term.

Plants & greenery

Consider adding greenery to your bedroom. Plants can boost air quality, increase air circulation and extract chemicals. Spending just five minutes in nature has a calming effect, so why not bring the outdoors in?

Ferns, succulents, bamboo, aloe vera and ivy plants are easy care varieties for green-fingered beginners. Match the plant type to the level of light and ensure your plants are well watered and dusted frequently, as dust prevents sunshine absorption needed for good plant health.

Block light & sound

It sounds obvious, but ensure all chinks of light are blocked, as sunshine is a natural indicator to our body to wake up. Use blackout blinds and ensure curtains are fully closed before sleep. Similarly, use earplugs to block out any noise. Remember that a bedroom should be like a cave for optimal sleep, so ensure it is cool, dark and quiet ahead of sleep and throughout the night.

Bedding & nightwear

Avoid using synthetic materials such as polyester bedding and instead use linen, silk and cotton for the most natural bedding types. These breathable fabrics allow the body to both cool better and stay warmer. Invest in a natural duvet type, such as feather-down, and again avoid man-made materials as these can irritate the skin. The same goes for nightwear, so choose cotton, silk or linen for a more comfortable sleep experience. Keep an extra blanket close by should the temperature drop in the night.

Natural remedies

Adding essential oil fragrances into your room can aid sleep and create a soothing environment. Try spritzing your sheets with a light layer of lavender spray before sleep or use a diffuser with a natural scent such as mint or lemon. Taking a warm shower or bath with essential oils before bed can also make us feel more naturally tired, along with a hot drink (non-alcoholic).


Banish blue light

Blue light emitted from gadgets, computers, phones and screens is an instant signal to our brains and bodies to stay awake. Place these items in a different room and use a traditional alarm clock rather than a phone alarm. When it's dark, we release the chemical melatonin, which is crucial to trigger sleep as it makes the body relax and feel naturally drowsy, so don't let blue light prevent you from dropping off.

A good mattress will gently support your entire body while keeping your spine in a neutral position. HEALTHY KITCHEN DESIGN

Dean Weston from Commodore Design offers advice on how you can create kitchens that meet the growing demand for healthier living.

Now worth £3.5 trillion, the global wellness industry is rapidly growing as more and more people across the globe seek to improve their physical and mental wellbeing. This wellness mega trend is filtering through many aspects of our lives, including the design of our homes.

Kitchens, in particular, offer huge potential for housebuilders and developers to help their customers feel healthier and happier. Here are just some of the ways in which this can be achieved.

MULTISENSORY DESIGN

Multisensory design is already being used in workplaces and urban planning but can be reflected across the home too. It's a concept that acknowledges people experience and react to space in many ways, using all of their senses. This can affect the way we feel, our behaviour and physical and mental wellbeing.

For example, the colour of a kitchen will appeal to our sense of sight but there is also strong evidence that colour schemes can affect our mood. Research linked to colour chromotherapy, which is believed to affect body vibrations, has highlighted that different shades can trigger a variety of emotional responses. In the kitchen, this means a splash of the right colour could make a significant difference to the owner. Shades to consider include yellow, which can brighten a person's mood and increase energy, and blue which can increase a sense of calm and relaxation.

INCREASE NATURAL LIGHT

Lighting can be complex in a kitchen where functionality and comfort must combine, but it's another important consideration when designing for healthier living.

Too much artificial lighting can cause headaches and eye strain so different options such as dimmable lights must be weaved into the final design. However, one of the most beneficial solutions for our wellbeing is to flood the space with natural light.

Skylights and bifold doors work particularly well but if these aren't feasible then consider how kitchen finishes could be affected by light. For example, light coloured worktops can help to disperse light more evenly whereas darker ones will absorb more light. Gloss cabinets can also make the most of natural light.

KITCHENS

ADD NOISE MINIMISING FEATURES

Open plan spaces are here to stay, but sociable living needs to be balanced with high levels of comfort, including minimising noise.

This could involve zoning larger spaces using screening to help contain the noise or installing products and systems specifically designed to absorb noise. Recent innovations include acoustic panels printed with patterns for floor to ceiling applications as well as adjustable acoustic beams that can be applied to both ceilings and walls to absorb sound and are available in 17 colours.

The choice of kitchen appliance is also important to keep the peace and there are several products worth considering in this respect. 

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THE FIGHT FOR MARKET SHARE - MAN-MADE OR NATURAL!

There is a debate raging in the stone industry.

With the increase of market share by man-made materials, in areas traditionally occupied by natural stone, the choice for the consumer has increased. But not always in the full knowledge of what the choices contain and how they perform. What are the true ecological credentials of either and should we be using them at all?

The main battlefield is kitchen work surfaces. Traditionally made from natural marble, and in more recent years granite, limestone and slate - man-made guartz (or engineered quartz) has taken a large chunk of the market.

Is the natural stone industry just bleating about a successful rival, when they have long neglected to promote natural stone in any meaningful way themselves?

And if man-made quartz is the all singing, all dancing alternative to natural stone, why does it have to assume the names of natural stone, claim it is a version of stone and try to look like stone?

Man-made quartz (not to be confused with quartzite, which is a natural stone): a composite made from quartz mineral (approx. 75% by volume), bound together with a binder resin, (approx. 24% by volume), and then coloured with pigments, (1 to 2%). Heated, calibrated and polished. The finished product tends to come in singular colours, some with sparkles. Manufacturer's claim it is chip resistant, moisture and stain resistance and hygienic. There are warnings about placing hot pans directly on the surface as they may crack the material or leave burn marks.

The market is becoming saturated with choices and there is an unhealthy market for unbranded material, without the manufacturer's mark printed on the back, appearing as a cheaper alternative, and therefore without the manufacturer's guarantee.

There is also another man-made product on the market called Lapitec which is a "sintered stone", available from the Marble and Granite Centre in Rickmansworth, which uses 100% natural products, is inert, recyclable and has excellent ecological credentials.

Natural granite is igneous rock, formed at high temperatures in the earth's crust, made up of varying quantities of feldspar, quartz, and mica. The name is applied to a variety of igneous rock, similar in structure, but not all the same. Generally, it is hard wearing, heat resistant and can be sealed to resist liquid ingress, which makes maintenance simple. It can be highly polished or honed. Colours can be uniform pinks and creams - salt and pepper or wild and unique.

Marble and limestone are increasingly specified for high end luxury apartment work-tops. These look beautiful, but the materials are calcium carbonate based and can be susceptible to acid etching from citreous fruit, wine and household cleaners. Though some prefer the natural patina that develops on the surface of these stones with age and use.

What can you do with all those the old worksurfaces once you decide to replace them in 10 or 20 years' time? Will an indestructible pile of inorganic resin bonded material pile-up somewhere, like the fridge mountains of earlier this century? What is contained in the resin that binds the man-made quartz together? Certainly Lapitec and all natural stones can be crushed and returned to the earth, naturally.


More questions than answers? Ultimately, the beauty is in the eye of the beholder. Perhaps, like imitations gone before, natural stone will shrug off the competition in time. After all, its been around for millions of years and will probably be around for a few more. Will its rivals?





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MAKING WORKSPACES SAFE -WHAT EVERYONE SHOULD KNOW BEFORE INVESTING IN AN AIR PURIFICATION SYSTEM

After extensive research, ASHRAE, the worldwide trade association for HVAC professionals, have now come forward to recommend that building owners consider UVGI (Ultra Violet Germicidal Irradiation) combined with autonomous circulation fans to protect staff and customers from viruses, such as Coronavirus and other harmful pathogens. These types of system use PHI (Photohydroionisation) Cells which are integrated into fans to 'Actively' clean the air by flooding indoor environments with lonised Hydro-Peroxides. These are referred to as "mother nature's cleaning agents" by the scientific community, as they occur naturally and are the reason the air smells fresh after a thunderstorm.

In independent research, results showed that PHI fan technology eradicated up to 99% of all known viruses and pathogens. It also showed that with an active in-room PHI fan, over 99% of the germs in a human sneeze are neutralised before they can travel 2 metres.

So, for anyone investing in air purification technology it might be worthwhile considering ASHRAE's advice and looking into the simple-to-install, ductless, PHI fans as an approved, safe and tested solution.


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TOP 5 BENEFITS OF RENDERED FAÇADE SYSTEMS

MAKITA ADDS TO NEW XGT 40V RANGE WITH NEW DRILLS AND DRIVERS



Makita UK has introduced its new XGT range of cordless high-performance 40V Max tools, with the addition of two models of rotary hammer, a new combi-drill and an impact driver – ideal for heavy duty applications where cordless may not have previously coped. All four new products benefit from Makita's advanced brushless motor technology.

The HR003G and HR004G 40V Max Brushless Rotary Hammers offer outstanding performance with speeds up to 980 revolutions per minute (rpm) and up to 5,000 blows per minute (bpm) of hammer action. They feature a variable speed trigger and three function options - rotary hammer, rotary only and hammer only – making them versatile and easy to adjust to each task. The HR004G is also equipped with a Quick Change Chuck to make switching between drill bits fast and simple.

Both machines include Makita's Anti-Vibration Technology (AVT) for improved operator comfort and safety. When hammer drilling into concrete the HR003G and HR004G have vibration levels of just 7.0m/s2 and 6.5m/s2 respectively for increased safe trigger times. To protect users from dust inhalation during operation, the rotary hammers are compatible with the DX12 (HR003G) and DX14 (HR004G) dust boxes.

The highly versatile HP00IG Combi Drill is compact and easy to handle. It has a variable speed trigger and two mechanical gears with a broad range of clutch settings – 41 in gear one and 21 in gear two. This makes it easy to finely adjust the output for the task at hand. The HP00IG has a capacity of 20mm in steel and masonry and 76mm in wood. In high gear it has a speed of 2,600 rpm and delivers up to 39,000 blows per minute when in impact drilling mode. This protects the user from injury if the drill bit jams in the material.



Also added to the Makita range, is the powerful TD00IG Brushless Impact Driver. It delivers up to 220 newton-metres (Nm) of torque with the choice of four power modes (Max, Hi, Mid and Lo), selected using a simple one touch control, in addition to six assist modes. In the highest power mode, it has a maximum speed of 3,700 rpm and delivers up to 4,400 impacts per minute.
