

Dozens of people arrested, 30 police officers injured as tensions erupt in West Philly following fatal police-involved shooting

PHILADELPHIA (WPVI) -- At least 90 people have been arrested and at least 30 police officers have been injured as tensions erupted in West Philadelphia after police shot and killed a man armed with a knife, according to officials.

Authorities said officers confronted Walter Wallace on Monday afternoon. Police said Wallace was shot multiple times by two officers after he didn't adhere to calls to drop the weapon. He was later pronounced dead.

Officials said most of the injuries to officers that occurred overnight are reported to be the result of being struck by projectiles, such as bricks and rocks.

One officer, however, a 56-year-old Philadelphia Police Sergeant, was struck by a pickup truck in the area of 52nd and Walnut streets around 12:45 a.m. Tuesday. Officials said she sustained a broken leg and various other injuries. She has been admitted to the hospital in stable condition.

The 29 other officers have reportedly been treated and released from area hospitals.

In 2017, Hunter Biden, his uncle James Biden, and three other business partners sought an investment deal with a Chinese energy company and used future Democratic presidential nominee Joe Biden's good graces with Colombian President Juan Manuel Santos in order to try and make the partnership happen, according to a copy of the pitch document published by *The Daily Caller*. In their investment pitch, Biden's group SinoHawk sought a \$10 million seed investment from CEFC China Energy, and pitched joint ventures in places like Colombia. "Mr. Biden pledged his strong personal support of the peace process and offered congratulations to Mr. Santos while underscoring 'the importance of maintaining bipartisan support for Colombia in the United States Congress'," the investment proposal reads, alongside a photo of Joe Biden. CEFC China Energy eventually didn't partner with SinoHawk for the deal.

Businessman Tony Bobulinski, who was part of the SinoHawk group, said that Hunter and James "aggressively leveraged" their family's name and reputation in order to successfully close foreign business deals. Joe Biden has repeatedly said that he never discussed business with his son, and that he never benefited from, or participated in, Hunter's business dealings.

179 arrested in Ohio antihuman trafficking sting 'Operation Autumn Hope'

The Ohio Attorney General's office on Monday announced the completion of a campaign against human trafficking, called "Operation Autumn Hope," that resulted in 179 arrests and 109 victims rescued.

Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost (R) <u>said in a press release</u> that the operation, coordinated by the attorney general's Ohio Organized Crime Investigations Commission, included more than 50 law enforcement agencies and other organizations as part of a mission to end sex trafficking across the state.

According to the news release, the jointly led operation had four primary goals: rescuing human trafficking victims, recovering missing and exploited children, apprehending those looking to have sex with a minor and arresting those looking to buy sex with a minor.

The 109 victims rescued by the Central Ohio Human Trafficking Task Force, Columbus PACT Unit and the Cuyahoga County Human Trafficking Task Force were referred to social services, according to the press release.

"The success of Operation Autumn Hope is measured not only in the number of arrests but in the lives that were rescued from this evil," Yost said in the release. "Every agency on this team looks for the day when no person is bought and sold in Ohio."

Federal employee union sues over Trump civil service executive order

The lawsuit argues that Trump's order will "radically reshape the civil service by drastically increasing the number and type of employees who are subject to dismissal."

The National Treasury Employees Union filed a lawsuit in federal court seeking to strike down an executive order by President Donald Trump that the union says will strip civil service and due process protections from certain policymaking federal workers.

The lawsuit, filed Monday in the D.C. district court, argues that Trump's order last week will "radically reshape the civil service by drastically increasing the number and type of employees who are subject to dismissal without adverse action rights."

Critics fear the change would make it easier to remove policy experts and career civil servants who do not agree with the administration's policies.

Trump's order would reclassify some workers "in positions of a confidential, policy-determining, policy-making, or policy-advocating character" into a new category that is exempt from protections that apply to most federal workers — allowing agencies to hire and terminate them more quickly.

The move prompted Federal Salary Council Chair Ron Sanders, a Trump appointee, to resign Monday in protest, warning that the order was "clearly an attempt to require the political loyalty of those who advise the President."

The NTEU, which represents 150,000 federal government employees, says

Trump exceeded his authority under the merit-based rules for how federal
workers are chosen for government positions, which only allow the president to
exclude certain positions when "necessary" and "as conditions of good
administration warrant."
