

UMi-TWINN conference

The coordinator UMi organised the 'Industry 4.0, Logistics 4.0: Challenges and Opportunities' conference on the 22nd of May 2017 in Budapest. The UMi-TWINN conference was the first of its kind as UMi decided to create a brand new conference format focusing on Logistics as well as the trendy topic of Industry 4.0. The hard work of partners and the dedication of UMI's staff allow attracting more than 75 participants from research organisations, the industry as well as Hungarian stakeholders and policy-makers from the Ministry for National Economy and the National Assembly of Hungary.

All the UMi-TWINN partners participated in the conference and were really happy with its outcomes. The Institute of Logistics at UMi considerably learns from this experience and we hope this new conference will be renewed in the near future.

The invited press also attended the event and the UMi-TWINN conference received a broader coverage thanks to the national TV.

Summer school in Magdeburg – February 2017

Based on the success of the first summer school in Graz, the partner Fraunhofer-IFF decided to hold the second UMi-TWINN summer school at their premises in Magdeburg (Germany) from 19 February to 4 March 2017.

During these two weeks, the participants received training on theory (e.g. logistics planning, analysis and simulation) and gained experience via practical exercises (e.g. simulation workshop, team projects, management games). Similarly to the 1st summer school, several site visits to relevant logistics organisations have been organised such as Volkswagen, Hermes Fulfilment and Amazon. Overall the summer school attracted 28 participants from Hungary (UMi) as well as students from Italy, Russia, Ukraine, Latvia, Kyrgyzstan and Kazakhstan.









Recently, several representatives from the Logistics Institute at UMi participated to the 4th International Physical Internet Conference - IPIC17 organised by our partner TU Graz. The conference ran from the 4 to the 6 of July 2017 and UMi-TWINN has been one of the project sponsors of the event.
