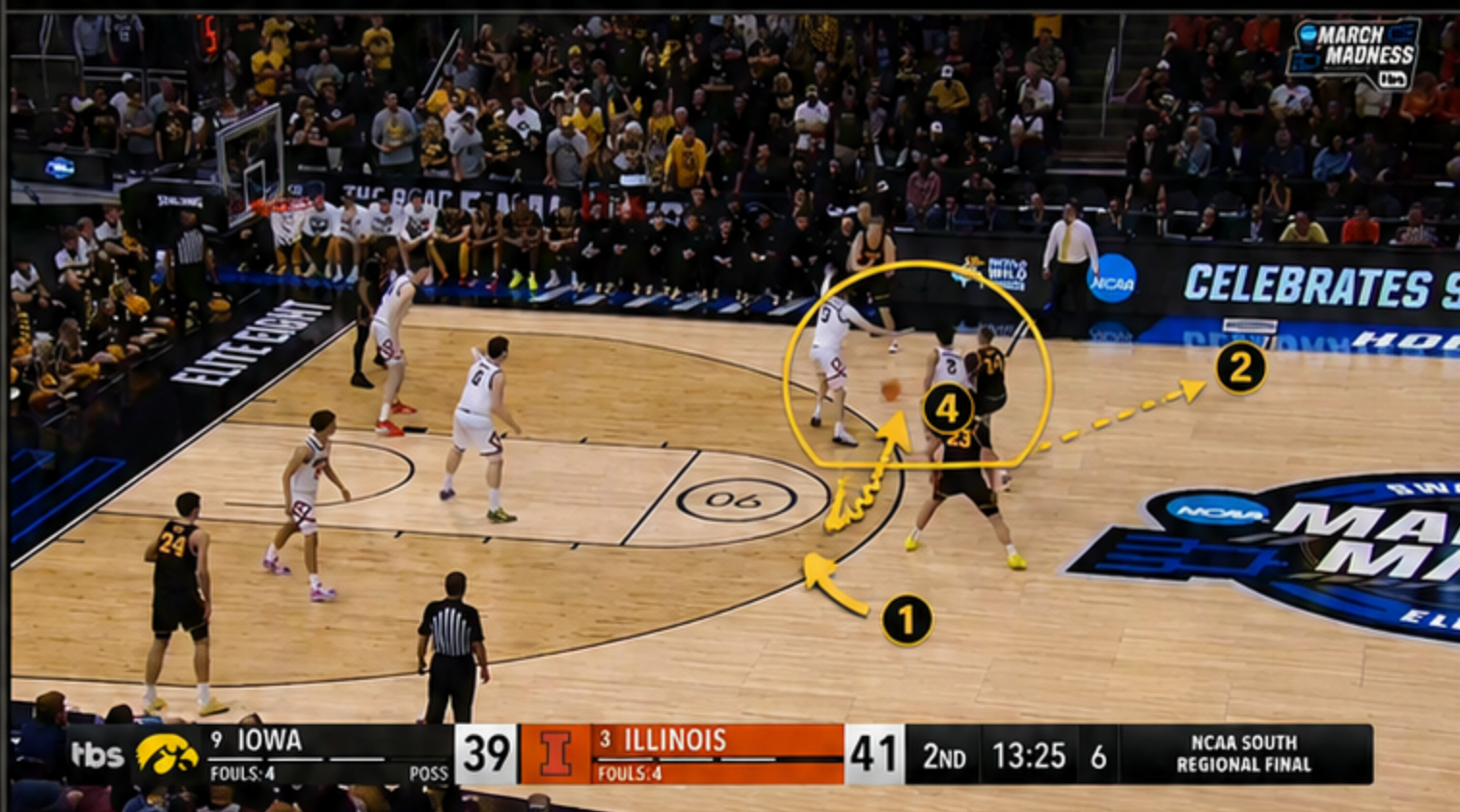

ADVANTAGE DNA™

- Ball swing to 1
- ↓
- 4 arrives into high ball screen
- ↓
- 5 slides to ball side
- ↓
- 1 attacks off the screen
- ↓
- Defense shifts to contain
- ↓
- Kick-out to 2

ADVANTAGE FRAME — 13:25 2ND



FASTDRAW SEQUENCE



1. Ball is swung to the 1 at the top.



1. 4 sets high ball screen for 1.
2. 5 slide to ball side.



1. 1 attacks and kicks to 2.
2. 4 pops on the ball screen

STARTING ALIGNMENT

Ball is swung to 1 at the top. Open spacing with 3 on the left side, 2 on the right side, 4 ready to screen, and 5 sliding to ball side.

WHAT HAPPENS

4 sets a high ball screen for 1. As 1 attacks, 5 slides to the ball side. 1 forces the defense to shift and kicks the ball to 2. After screening, 4 pops.

DEFENSIVE REACTION

Illinois loads to the ball and shifts to contain the drive as the screen and slide action create pressure on the coverage.

OFFENSIVE READ

Attack downhill first. If help commits, spray the ball to 2. If the kick is taken away, 4 is available on the pop.

WHY IT WORKS

The quick high ball screen creates an advantage, 5's slide occupies help, and 4's pop stretches the defense, opening the kick-out window.

MAIN COACHING POINT

Use the screen with pace, force the defense to react, and make the simple kick-out read on time.

FINAL RESULT

Kick-out to 2 for an open perimeter shot.



DNA TAKEAWAY

ATTACK THE HIGH BALL SCREEN → SHIFT THE DEFENSE → KICK OUT TO THE OPEN SHOOTER.
