## Why Beta-Sitosterol Is the Key Ingredient

While some large clinical trials have produced mixed results, saw palmetto remains one of the most widely studied botanical ingredients for BPH, and it appears most effective in combination with beta-sitosterol rather than as a standalone ingredient.

## Pygeum Africanum Bark Extract

Derived from the bark of an African plum tree, pygeum africanum has been used in European medicine for BPH management since the 1960s. Incomplete bladder emptying is one of the primary causes of urinary frequency and urgency in BPH, making pygeum a logical complement to beta-sitosterol in a multiphase formula.

The FDA can take action against supplements that are found to be unsafe or that make unsubstantiated drug claims, but it does not grant pre-market approval.
